

TIGER LEADER INTRODUCTION TO PROGRAM GUIDE BOOK

SHARED LEADERSHIP:

- **Tiger Leader:** Organizes parents and keeps them on track.
- **Adult Partner:** Each boy / adult partner team takes 1 month.

ADVANCEMENT:

- **Earn Tiger Cub totem.**
 - o Motto (Search, Discover, Share)
 - o Sign.
 - o Salute
- **Totem beads.**
 - o Family activity. (white x 5)
 - o Den activity. (orange x 5)
 - o Go See It. (black x5)
- **Tiger Cub Badge**
 - Must earn all 15 beads. (In 5 Achievement areas / see page 12a)
- **Electives.** (yellow beads)
 - o 1 Tiger Track bead per 10 electives.
 - o Can work on electives anytime, but must have Badge before receiving bead.
 - Elective can be earned through Pack Activities
 - (11) Helping the needy – Scouting for Food Drive
 - (17) Make a model – Pinewood Derby held in April
 - (22) Picnic fun – Pack graduation picnic

MOVING ON:

- After earning the Tiger Cub Badge, boys may begin working on the Bobcat Badge.
- They should not be working on the Wolf Badge until 2nd grade (or 8 years old) after June 1st.
 - o Bobcat Badge Requirements
 - Learn and say the Cub Scout Promise
 - Say the Law of the Pack, tell what it means
 - Tell what Webelos means
 - Show the Cub Scout Handshake, tell what it means
 - Say the Cub Scout Motto
 - Give the Cub Scout Salute, tell what it means
 - With your Adult Partner, Complete “A Bobcat Requirement” (in front of handbook)

UNIFORMING:

- Tiger Cub wears blue shirt w/orange neckerchief
- Adult partners encouraged to wear orange Tiger shirts/sweatshirts
- Den Leader wears official Cub Scout Leader uniform with Cub Scout Leader neckerchief

- 1) Making My Family Special
 - a. **1F** Chore with Adult Partner (*Family Activity*)
 - b. **1D** Family Scrapbook (*Can be done as a Family Activity*)
 - c. **1G** Go See It (*Den Activity*):
 1. Library, Historical Society, Museum, Old Farm or an older person in the community

- 2) Where I Live
 - a. **2F** Look at map (*Family Activity*)
 - b. **2D** Practice Pledge of Allegiance – Pack flag ceremony
 - c. **2G** Go See It (*Den Activity*):
 1. Police Station, Fire Station or Ambulance Tour

- 3) Keeping Myself Healthy and Safe
 - a. **3F** Plan/practice a fire drill, plan if lost or separated (*Family Activity*)
 - b. **3D** Make a food guide pyramid (*Can be done as a Family Activity*)
 - c. **3G** Go See It (*Den Activity*):
 1. Any Sporting Event (Amateur or Professional)
 - a. Learn the rules of the game

- 4) How I Tell It
 - a. **4F** Family meal – discussion of day (*Family Activity*)
 - b. **4D** Play “Tell it like it isn’t” (*Can be done before the “Go See It”*)
 - c. **4G** Go See It (*Den Activity*):
 1. TV station, radio station, or newspaper

- 5) Let’s Go Outdoors (*Family Activity*)
 - a. **5F** Watch the weather
 - b. **5D** Leaf rubbing (*Can be done as a Family Activity*)
 - c. **5G** Go See It(*Den Activity*) :
 1. Go on a hike or bike ride

NOTE: Achievements #1 & #2 can be accomplished together by doing a “Go See It” at the Mankato Fire Station #1.
